

What is the concern?



- Must demonstrate a good career






RETAIN

AABP Membership Non-renewals by Grad Year

- Multifactorial problem
- #1 cause of loss = moved to companion animal

AABP POSITION STATEMENT

USE OF CREDENTIALED VETERINARY TECHNICIANS IN BOVINE PRACTICE



The American Association of Bovine Practitioners (AABP) Board of Directors supports the continued use of credentialed veterinary technicians (CVT) in bovine practice. A task force has been developed to provide further guidance on the use of CVTs in bovine practice. The AABP Board of Directors does not support the creation of a midlevel veterinary professional.

AABP POSITION STATEMENT

ESTABLISHMENT OF A VETERINARIAN-CLIENT-PATIENT RELATIONSHIP



The American Association of Bovine Practitioners (AABP) Board of Directors supports the requirement of a Veterinarian-Client-Patient relationship (VCPR) established through an in-person visit. Veterinary oversight and regular site visits are essential components of establishing and maintaining a VCPR. This relationship can be supplemented through laboratory data evaluation, records evaluation and telephonic or electronic communication. The AABP Board of Directors does not support establishment of the VCPR solely through virtual or electronic methods.
